- Choose one of the scenarios from the Ethical Dilemma Scenarios handout. Describe how
 you would apply the steps for analyzing and problem solving a dilemma to your scenario
 (tell us which number scenario you are using):
 - Identify the two ethical responsibilities which are in conflict (use codes of ethics for help as needed)
 - Use ethical guidelines to brainstorm possible solutions (come up with at least 2)
 - Evaluate the possibility of a "both/and" resolution

Related to Ethical Guidelines

- How would you describe the difference between *personal* values and *professional* values?

- Share an example of how one of the ICF ethical codes listed in Lecture Notes A might apply to RBPD work.

Related to Mandated Reporting Lecture Notes and Course

- Do you have any questions about the ethical responsibility of mandated reporting for RBPD Specialists?? (Direct participants to contact their licensor if there remain any unanswered questions at the end of this session.)
- Based on the information in the training (or from the DHS website) on mandated reporting and the information in Lecture Notes B-Mandated Reporting, think about what you would do if you were providing RBPD in a classroom or family child care home

and saw a clear case of abuse or maltreatment. What thoughts or questions arise for you related to:

- Steps you would need to take?
- The potential impact on relationships, for example how you might handle it if you were going to continue to be in a working relationship with the person?
- O Cultural considerations regarding reporting, including if the early childhood provider was an English Language Learner?

Related to Boundaries

- What is one boundary that stands out to you as particularly challenging in the RBPD relationships you have been part of or may be part of in the future (either as an RBPD provider or RBPD partner)? Explain your choice.
- Do you have any questions about the boundaries noted in Lecture Notes C-Boundaries?

Reflection Assignment:

Assignment (choose which level of assignment you plan to complete and note that level on your reflection). Decide the level based on whether you are currently doing RBPD work or not. If you are, please respond to Level 2, using examples from your own work. If you are not (yet) working in RBPD, respond to Level 1. Remember to include content and ideas from the rest of the session (readings, discussion, video chat) in your reflection:

Level 1:

- Read the article "Supervision or Coaching- What's the Difference".
- Write a 2/3 to a full page reflection on the article including:
 - O Listing three ways that supervision and coaching are different,
 - And three ways they overlap or where there might be confusion about roles.
 - Explain why it is important to be aware of the possible confusion about boundaries between these two roles.
